Why volunteer with Community Alliance?	Community Alliance is the essential link to empowering our community groups, building local partnerships and improving residents' lives. We provide a diverse range of services to develop, enhance and empower voluntary and community groups to effectively serve their communities, including the running of our own projects like the Community Car Scheme. Volunteering is a great way of supporting these worthwhile causes. You will gain valuable skills, meet new people and make a noticeable difference in our clients' lives.
Who benefits?	Clients who struggle to get to essential appointments (health, daily needs, social purposes, etc.) and are unable to drive or use public transport can use the Car Scheme. This supports their independence and wellbeing.
Purpose	To increase mobility and independence especially for vulnerable, elderly and less mobile residents of East Herts and Broxbourne. Offer practical support, friendly company and a safe journey to and from their essential appointments.
Main tasks	Taking clients from their homes to their essential appointments and back, using your own vehicle. Accompanying them at the destination if necessary (e.g. hospital, GP, essential visits, etc.).
Skills, experience and qualities needed	 Safe and experienced driver Clean driving license Access to a vehicle insured for voluntary purposes Comply with legal standards (insurance, tax, MOT) Enhanced DBS check through Community Alliance Enjoy working with elderly, disabled and impaired clients with patience and empathy Some lifting, e.g. of mobility aids, may be required Friendly and service-oriented



BROXBOURNE & EAST HERTS

When?	Mostly weekdays am/pm. Some lifts on weekends. You can offer your time according to your personal circumstances. Community Alliance Car Scheme office team will send you requests for lifts which you can confirm or decline. You can also permanently or temporarily exclude certain time slots during the week when you go away or have other plans. No minimum time commitment. Very flexible role.
Where?	The Car Scheme mainly operates for clients living in East Herts. If we have capacity, we also cover Broxbourne. You will be using your own vehicle to transport clients who live near you to keep costs low and avoid unnecessary mileage. However, this may not always be possible. Expenses are covered for every mile: from your door to the client, to the destination and back.
Support offered	 Clients pay the driver 50p per mile and parking fees. The prices are worked out by the Car Scheme office and shared with driver and client in advance. Clients pay drivers cash on the day of the lift. Further expenses can be covered by Community Alliance according to our volunteer agreement. Induction and driver documents before starting Ongoing training, e.g. manual handling, first aid, etc. Named contacts Regular exchange with volunteer coordinator Social events
What could volunteers get out of it?	Our volunteers find this volunteering opportunity rewarding because they can help clients to get around, meet new people and offer their help in a personal and flexible way whilst getting out and about. Community Alliance can provide a reference after a minimum of three months of volunteering which can improve career prospects. We want to ensure that anyone volunteering within Community Alliance finds their role rewarding and we strive to provide an enjoyable volunteering experience. We have been awarded the <u>Investing in</u> <u>Volunteers</u> quality standard for Volunteer management.
